Key Biodiversity Areas (KBAs)

Why in news?


 A recent study has revealed that key biodiversity areas in tropical forests have shifted to higher temperature regimes as a result of global warming and climate change.

Key Facts •Initiated by BirdLife International with the identification of Important Bird and **Biodiversity Areas (IBAs).**

• In 2004, IUCN recognized the need for a global framework, leading to the 2016 KBA Standard.

Identifying Key Biodiversity Areas

• **Definition:** KBAs are sites that are globally important for the persistence of biodiversity, identified based on globally standardised criteria.



Biodiversity Hotspots: Areas with high biodiversity facing significant threats.

• India has 862 Key Biodiversity Areas (KBAs), which are crucial for the conservation of biodiversity E.g : Western Ghats.

Why in news?

• The government has now issued specific guidelines to restrain false or misleading climatefriendly claims about products claims

Key Facts

•Misleading practice where companies falsely portray their products or practices as environmentally friendly.

- •Used to attract eco-conscious consumers without substantial environmental benefits.
- •Common tactics: vague terms ("natural," "eco-friendly"), irrelevant claims, or false labels.

Ladakh Aurorae


Why in news?

Aurora lights in red hues were visible from Ladakh's pristine skies late at night. Auroras are often witnessed in the extreme northern or southern latitudes, such as near the North and South Poles.

Key Facts

- Auroras occur due to interactions between charged solar winds and Earth's magnetosphere during geomagnetic storms.
- Mechanism: Ejected solar particles get trapped in Earth's magnetic field and collide with atmospheric atoms, releasing energy as light.
- Types: Northern Hemisphere: Aurora Borealis (Northern Lights) & Southern Hemisphere:

 Aurora Australis (Southern Lights)
- Made of oxygen and nitrogen gases.
- Color variations depend on the type of gas and altitude of collisions.
- **Reason for Auroras in Ladakh:** Heightened solar flare activity from Coronal Mass Ejections (CMEs) leading to auroras visible in lower-latitude regions like Ladakh, as well as parts of the US and UK.

GRAP(Graded Action Response plan)

Why in news?

The Air Quality Index in Delhi dropped following Dussehra celebrations, leading to the invocation of Stage 1 of the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP).

Key Facts

- The Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) is a set of specific emergency measures designed to combat air pollution in the **National Capital Region (NCR) of India**.
- It was developed by the Environmental Pollution (Prevention & Control) Authority (EPCA) and is implemented by the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) to respond to different levels of air pollution.
- GRAP is activated based on the **Air Quality Index (AQI)** levels, which determine the severity of air pollution, and it is enforced in stages to reduce the harmful effects of pollution on public health and the environment.

Stage-wise Implementation of GRAP

Air Quality Management Stages






Which actions to implement based on AQI levels?

Stage 1 Actions

Mechanized sweeping, sprinkling water, anti-smog guns, stricter PUC norms.



Restrict construction, ban industrial operations, stop stone-crushing and hot-mix plants.

Stage 2 Actions

Ban diesel generators, increase public transport. shut down brick kilns and stone crushers.

Stage 4 Actions

Odd-even vehicle schemes. shut down schools, enforce heavy restrictions on private vehicles.
